The governors of Southway School would like to take the opportunity to introduce ourselves and tell you a little bit about what we do.

The role of the governors is to support the school, offer guidance, determine the strategy and make sure the School is being well run.

We are very fortunate at Southway to have an outstanding and hardworking team who manage & run the school under the leadership of Headteacher, Mr Newbold. Ensuring that we have a great leadership team at the school is a key role of the governors. We are also there to challenge and ensure the correct decisions are being taken in the best interests of the school.

The governing body comprises the Headteacher & Senior Leadership team, the parent governors & co-opted governors and we meet typically once per month. Each review meeting has a well-defined agenda and covers topics such as teaching quality, finance, policies, compliance, safety and improvement projects.

The parent governors are all volunteers & are not education professionals as we are not involved in the day to day management of the school; rather we have a range of experiences and expertise that contributes to good governance of the school.

- Authorising spending for improvement projects to enhance the school environment and pupils learning experience
- Ensuring the quality of teaching and educational experience of the pupils is excellent
- Determining the strategy and direction of the school
- Oversee the vision and values that Southway stands for
- Staff recruitment
- Complaints
- Health and safety
- Safeguarding
