Year 4 - Victorians

Year 4 have immersed themselves in Victorian life this term.

In September, we headed off to Brighton and the children enjoyed their Victorian trail, finding out about all the aspects of Brighton which hold Victorian heritage. They had a brilliant fun-filled day out including a ride on the Volks

electric railway and enjoyed doughnuts on the Pier! They have taken part in a Victorian school day,



and had a visit from Rainbow Theatre. Throughout this term, the children have been really enthusiastic to explore the lives of both rich and poor Victorians, what it was like to work in a workhouse and even enjoyed baking some delicious Victorian sponge cakes!

Year 5 - Power and Palaces

This term we have been learning all about the Tudors, the Battle of Bosworth and King Henry VIII. In September, the children visited King

Henry VIII's home, Hampton Court Palace to find out how the Tudors lived. They studied Tudor medicine, learnt about Henry VIII's six wives and the reformation. The children had the opportunity

to design and make their own quiche tartlets and create portraits of Henry VIII in water colour for their art lessons, they re-enacted the Battle of Bosworth and were asked to make a raw egg survive a 3 metre drop — although not many did survive the fall! Curie class have have ended the term with their class assembly showing what they have learnt since September.



Year 6 – Frozen in Time

Many children took part in our Year 6 residential to PGL Osmington Bay in Weymouth and had a wonderful time experiencing new challenges and overcoming fears. Other children spent a fantastic week at Southway taking part in a whole host of activities including apron decorating and making a



delicious afternoon tea. Year 6 have been learning about survival in Antarctic conditions this term. During Survival Day they made a hearty soup, built shelters in the woods, and scaled the 24ft climbing wall. We have also had a brilliant visit to Brighton in November, with a flight on the i360, visit to the Rampion Centre to learn about the energy created by the wind farm, finished off with some delicious chips on the Pier!
