As you can imagine the decision to close the school is not taken lightly and I was in constant contact with the headteachers of all Burgess Hill schools and our Chair of Governors prior to making final decisions. On a separate note the following headline caught my eye in the press...'The tenth annual 'What Kids Are Reading' report found the 10 most popular books among the 750,000 secondary-age pupils surveyed were all written for primary pupils.
