As part of our continual drive for improvement I wanted to share with you some of the work being carried out over the Easter break. Our Year 3 outdoor classroom is being transformed into an underwater sea world by the artist who created the mural for our climbing wall. We are also having a rainforest mural created outside Hawking class. This extends to turning the floor in to a beach with rock pools. We are also planning a complete renovation of our dipping pond which will take place in the next few weeks. Part of this will also include an all weather path from school to the pond area allowing children and staff access all year round. This is all very exciting.

On a separate note we have established a partnership between ourselves and a local school and I wanted to share with you the email I received shortly after from the Headteacher.
