We aim to ensure that at the end of KS2 children will meet ARE in reading, writing, maths and RWM in line with or above national averages'

### PRIORITY 1: Improve attainment and progress for all children in reading

#### We will ensure that we:

- Improve the vocabulary of our children
  - Ensuring children are reading appropriately challenging texts at home and in school
  - Provide high quality questioning from adults, drawing on vocabulary, through guided reading sessions
- Use class readers, pitched just above the children in the class
- Teachers will read class readers no less than three times a week
- Provide clear expectations and focus area within all guided reading sessions
  - Display VIPERS in all classrooms, with a focus for each week
- Provide Reciprocal reading cards used within book club, to give each child a focused task within the session
- Baseline all Year 3 children on entry
- Raise the profile and celebrate reading through:
  - The 100 book challenge
  - The monthly book raffle
  - Termly reading award
  - o Inviting appropriate authors to stimulate children
- Continue visits to Burgess Hill Library

### PRIORITY 2: Improve attainment and progress for all children in writing

#### We will ensure that we:

- Improve children's knowledge, understanding and application of grammar, punctuation and spelling
  - o GPS taught discretely by class teacher weekly
  - o GPS taught each week to be highlighted by children when used in their own writing
- Washing lines will display current GPS teaching
- Develop staff subject knowledge of GPS
  - Staff will familiarise themselves with the expectations outlined for their own year group and beyond
- Staff to know the spelling patterns, rules and words expected within their phase
- Continue to offer experiences for children to stimulate good quality writing whilst using high quality texts to underpin writing
- To ensure that the audience and purpose of all writing purposes is clear to children
- To ensure that the whole writing process is evidenced in books demonstrating choice and independence. To include:
  - Planning
  - Drafting
  - Proof reading
  - Editing and responding to feedback
  - Publishing
- Provide Handwriting lessons to meet the expectations as set out by the ESL
- Moderate writing regularly:
  - To moderate termly in phases (upper and lower) using exemplars provided by STA / LA to support
  - o To moderate half termly in year groups using exemplars provided by STA / LA to support
- Engage in moderation with locality and external moderators where available

#### **PRIORITY 3:**

# Improve attainment and progress for all children in maths

### We will ensure that we:

- Teach children weekly how to reason verbally and in written form as evidenced in books through the use of:
  - I see reasoning
  - Sentence starters as displayed in classrooms
  - Testbase or similar auestions
- Ensure that counters / resources are utilised correctly and regularly particularly in lower KS2.
- Adopt and implement Times Tables Rockstars in all year groups
- Develop staff subject knowledge of maths.
- Familiarise staff with the expectations outlined for their own year group and beyond.
- Implement the school's calculation policy from year 3 to 6.
- Develop staff understanding of challenge in a class setting through CPD and staff training.



#### **PRIORITY 4:**

## Strengthen Leadership at all levels We will ensure that:

- Staff will receive a personalised programme of CPD appropriate to their role.
- All staff meetings will include the opportunity to feedback following any training attended.
- Timetabled meetings for SLT, ELT and YGLs take place and the i Impact of the meetings will be discussed and noted.
- All leaders will maintain logs of actions and the subsequent impact.
- YGLs monitor their teams for consistency of approach and the implementation of all school policies.
- YGLs ensure the focus of visits to other classrooms will be in line with the priorities for RWM.
- YGLs will be supported by a member of the SLT.
- Subject leadership will be carried out in teams.
- Training opportunities for new core and foundation subject leaders will take place.
