Investment in the school & school finances

Over the course of this last school year we have continued to invest heavily in improvement projects across the school, we have spent close to £30,000 this year on school projects including carpets, decoration, new Clevertouch TVs in the classrooms, new fire doors, relocating the ICT Suite to the LaRC with new furniture. This takes the total investment in school improvement projects to £135,700 over the last 5 years.

School finances are in excellent shape, which in such difficult times for schools is testament to the focus placed in this area over a number of years. The school is the envy of many schools in the local authority, some of whom are operating budget deficits. We have been managing school finances, using long term planning, for several years and this management and discipline by the leadership team is paying off by allocating precious funds to improve the learning environment and opportunities for our children.

Health & Safety and our new Premises Manager

In addition to the improvements within the school, we have invested time and funds in improving all health and safety aspects at the school. Our new Premises Manager, Gareth Kirby, has made a huge difference in improving the look and feel of the outside of the school as well as dealing and improving the conditions of the school for the health and safety of children, staff and visitors alike.

SATS performance

It's worth noting just how well the children performed during the SATS week. They were a total credit to the school and as the Governing Body we were very proud of them. The staff during this period, too, were all exemplary. The results are the best Southway has ever produced and demonstrates, again, the continual striving for improvement that characterises the governing body and staff of Southway.

Local Authority colleagues

We are continuously supported and challenged by our local authority colleagues and this last year was no different. During the course of the year we had feedback on the schools' progress from Senior Advisers as well as an external consultant, Maria Roberts. They were all very complimentary about the school and were able to provide some pointers for minor improvement.

Leadership in the locality and the county

What many of you may not know is the level of influence that our Headteacher and Deputy Headteacher are having across the locality & community. Mr Newbold is a member, alongside two other Headteachers, of the Mid-Sussex Area Improvement and Inclusion Board that supports schools identified as needing guidance and advice. He is also the Headteacher representative for the Burgess Hill school's Headteachers as well as a West Sussex mentor for newly appointed Headteachers. Mrs Denison is currently completing her NPQH (National Professional Qualification for Headship) and spent a term as the Acting Headteacher of another school.
