Year 6 Spring Term

What will we be doing in each subject?

Our focus at Southway is very much on a creative curriculum. We aim to develop the children as independent learners and give them opportunities to lead the direction of a learning journey whenever possible. This requires some flexibility within the curriculum but we will cover the following skills over the course of the Spring term.

In English we will be writing short stories, diary entries and creating non-fiction pages.

In Science we will be learning about light and electricity; making a variety of circuits, which will link closely with our DT this term.

In Computing, we will be exploring programs involving control and simulation and creating hyperlinked presentations.

PE lessons will cover dance and gymnastics, as well as invasion games including tag rugby and hockey.

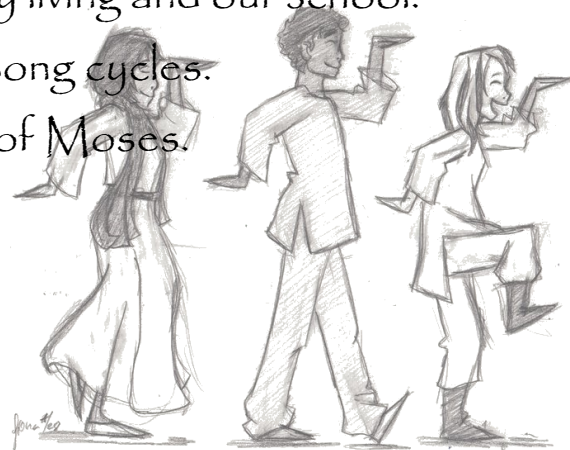
Art and DT lessons will focus on creating and controlling lego models, sculpting canopic jars from clay and creating Egyptian collars.

In Humanities, we will be identifying artefacts, considering what it takes to be an archaeologist, and how we have found out about the past. We will also be exploring the climate and landscape in ancient and modern Egypt.

In French, we will be learning about healthy living and our school.

In Music, we will be singing and exploring song cycles.

In RE lessons, we will study the life story of Moses.



This term, we shall experience...

- A trip to the British Museum, in London, to see the amazing Egyptian artefacts and take part in an Ancient Egypt workshop (approximate cost : £14.00)
- Rainbow Theatre, bringing Egypt to life through the story of Moses (approximate cost : £4.00)
- The Great Egyptian Bake-Off—baking shortbread. Making garlic bread (50p contribution for each)
