We are pleased to report a positive set of results for this year's year six cohort. Although progress scores are not yet above national averages, we have seen significant improvements since last year, with reading progress in particular being 14% higher than in 2013.

Pleasingly, our attainment results are very positive, with the following successes:

- Attainment is above national averages in almost every area – see the above table.
- Reading - a particular success story, with results well above national averages at L4+ and L5
- Writing – our level 5 percentage is Southway's best ever.
- Maths - we are delighted for the five children who achieved level 6 – the first time at Southway that any children have attained this level.
- GPS – significant improvements on 2013, and well above national averages
