West Sussex Local Authority Visit

In June the Local Authority advisers had this to say about the school...

'The school self-evaluation and improvement plan documents show thorough and rigorous planning and monitoring. School leaders have high expectations of pupils and staff which secure improvement in all pupils including disadvantaged pupils. The school continues to provide and develop a broad and balanced curriculum provides a wide range of opportunities for pupils to learn. The range of subjects and courses helps pupils acquire knowledge, understanding and skills in all aspects of their education, including the humanities and linguistic, mathematical, scientific, technical, social, physical and artistic learning. Pupil behaviour and behaviour for learning is exemplary. The curriculum also contributes well to pupils behaviour and welfare, including their physical, mental and personal well-being, safety and spiritual, moral, social and cultural development. In discussion with the Locality Link adviser it was agreed that school leaders should consider evaluating against the Outstanding OFSTED criteria for effective leadership and management.'

Visits from West Sussex schools

Over the course of the term we hosted the staff from schools such as Barns Green Primary and Thomas a Becket Junior in Worthing to come and see our excellent teaching practice as part of their own school development. Our staff also made reciprocal visits.

Humanities Week

For a week children were immersed in the cultures and geography of other nations and learnt what it is to be part of a global community.

School visits and trips

WHAT HAVE WE BEEN DOING?

Year 3 – have been learning all Roman and Celtic life as part of our exciting, yet often gruesome history! Year 5 – It has been an excellent term in year 5 where we have learnt lots of fascinating information about the Ancient Greeks, plants and mini beasts. As well as learning

about how the Greeks lived, what they ate (including cooking and trying some different foods ourselves) we also discovered how and why they started democracy. The children also researched different Greek myths and then recreated their own, adding interesting twists. We have been lucky enough to have a visit from Sir Teach-a-lot and Mark Chorley, who showed us the amazing hidden wildlife here at Southway and taught us about the plants and trees on the grounds. The term was rounded off with the Connect with the Countryside trip, highlights included chick cuddles, dancing sheep and bread making!

Year 6 – have had a busy Summer term! The term kicked off with the children completing their SATs tests, which they had worked incredibly hard towards. They were then rewarded with a fun-filled day

out at Chessington. A day enjoyed by all! Before half term, we enjoyed a mini Stone Age to Iron Age topic, complete with a visit from Sir Teach-a-lot, who ran an inspiring workshop. After the half term break, 2 weeks of 'safer cycling' ensued. The children endured rain and shine with smiling faces. Their time at Southway drew to a close, with an amazing production of 'Robin and the Sherwood Hoodies' - a West End worthy performance! Finally, we ended with our Leaver's Assembly, a lovely way to say goodbye. We wish all the Year 6 pupils, the best of luck as they move onto Secondary School.
