Primary School PE and Sport Funding School Statement 2014/15

Everything we do at Southway Junior School is driven by a desire to provide the best educational experience for our children.

We acknowledge the role that PE has in the health and well-being of our children. We consider that a broad and balanced curriculum and a variety of extra-curricular activities has a positive influence on the concentration, self-esteem, academic achievements and attitudes of our children

The Government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013-2014 and 2014-2015 to improve provision of Physical Education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding – provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – will be allocated to primary schools. The funding is ring-fenced and can, therefore, only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

PE at our school

- A wide range of PE is delivered to all pupils, which aims to inspire and engage all pupils
- A variety of festivals are attended to increase pupil participation including: Netball, gymnastics, basketball and tag rugby.
- Sports taught both during curriculum time and after school are varied. These include: dance, gymnastics, badminton, handball, hockey, netball football, swimming, athletics, cricket, rounders and orienteering to name a few.
- > A range of competitive sporting competitions are entered.
- > There are intra-school competitions (children predominately compete in houses).
- > Leadership opportunities for the children (sports captains and sports crew).
- > Outdoor adventure activities provided on year 6 residential trip.
- The school provides a range of after school sporting clubs, some of which are run by staff and some by outside providers. Clubs on offer include: Netball, handball, tag-rugby, gymnastics, pop-steps, football, badminton, stoolball and cross country.

Learning and achieving together

















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The sports premium will enable us to extend our provision for the children, through offering more clubs, entering an increased amount of competitions and training our staff to provide high quality PE lessons.

What is the Sports Premium? And what is the purpose of it?

This is funding provided by the Government, awarded to Primary School Headteachers to spend on improving the quality and provision of sport and PE for all children. This money is for sole use in this area only.

Proposed uses of the funding

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified coaches to work alongside teachers when teaching PE.
- > Paying for professional development opportunities in PE (courses)
- > Membership of Mid-Sussex Sports Partnership.
- Providing cover for teachers to be realised for professional development and to attend locality competitions.
- > Increasing participation in inter-school competitions.
- Buying necessary equipment.

Reporting

- > The Headteacher, in their termly report to Governors, will report on
 - how the Primary school PE and Sport Funding money has been spent;
 - an outline of the provision that was made since the last report;
 - an assessment of pupils' skills and development in PE and sport;
- The Governors of the school will ensure that there is a statement on the school website detailing how the Primary School PE and Sport funding has been used.
