Dear families

At Southway we have always placed great importance on our children being encouraged to be independent learners and not rely on the teacher to be the 'sage on the stage'. As a staff we plan learning with the aim of ensuring children work harder in lessons than adults and with the catchphrase 'inside out learning' as our starting point. This simply means that we stimulate curiosity and ask children to find answers, solve problems and ask questions before any misunderstandings or misconceptions are addressed. Teachers no longer stand at the front and 'deliver' content. Our guided reading sessions and our maths teaching in particular promote this well, with their reliance on children working in small groups or on their own. This caused me to reflect on the fact that as school age children move through the system they often become less independent learners rather than more. KS1 children have a natural curiosity and enthusiasm to 'find out', experiment and discover. And yet by the time they reach GCSE level and beyond they are more likely to receive information and be expected to regurgitate it. This week I was privileged to witness a year 4 GPS (Grammar, Punctuation & Spelling) lesson where children had to do all of the thinking for themselves and demonstrate what they had learned rather than fill in a sheet. In my day this would have been unthinkable. We live in more enlightened times. *'He who learns but does not think, is lost! He who thinks but does not learn is in great danger.'*

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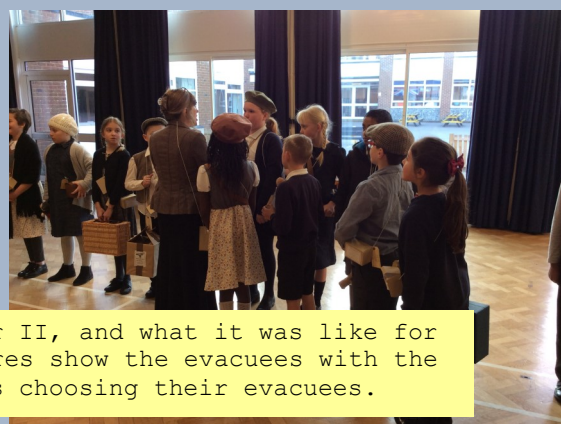
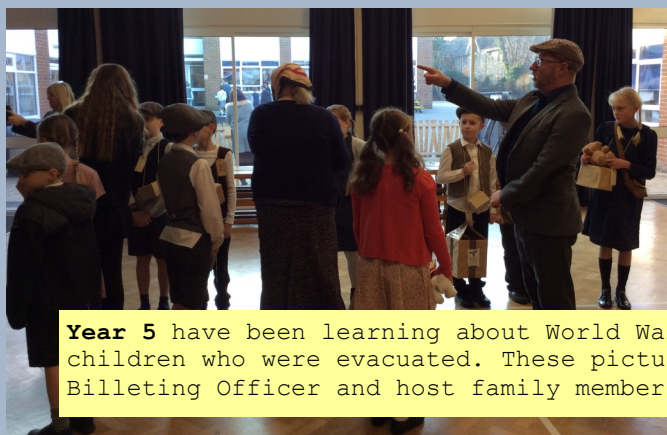
**'Learning and Achieving
