

"2016 was the first year of the new key stage 2 tests in maths, reading and grammar, punctuation and spelling. The tests assess children against a national standard... As the new standard is higher than the old one, fewer children have met the new expected standard than the previous standard." (Standards and Testing Agency July 2016)

Below is the national picture for the percentage of children reaching age related expectations in their SATs compared with the school's results.
