Ollie from Shakespeare Class was awarded the 'Player of the Week' by his team for scoring 4 goals in one match for Hassocks F. C.

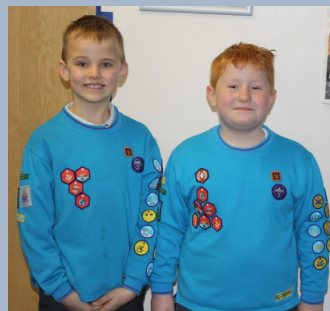
George from Dickens Class won a trophy for coming 3rd place in a Badminton Tournament, where he also came 1st in the doubles competition, & won a medal.
