Primary School PE and Sport Funding School Statement

Everything we do at Southway Junior School is driven by a desire to provide the best educational experience for our children.

The Government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013-2014 and 2014-2015 to improve provision of Physical Education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding – provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport – will be allocated to primary schools. The funding is ring-fenced and can, therefore, only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

Provision

Our school will be looking to spend the additional funding on improving our provision of PE and sport. Some of the ways we may do this are –

- Forge greater links with local secondary schools and utilise their PE specialist teachers to support and up-skill our own staff;
- Introduce new sports clubs into the school to provide the children with more variety, e.g. stoolball and badminton;
- Bring in specialist cricket coaching to maximise opportunities for our children;
- Provide release time for the our in-house PE co-ordinator, to further develop and deliver the curriculum in an exciting way;
- Utilise specialist external coaches to further develop staff skills;
- Introduce a “Fit Club”, in line with ‘Change 4 Life’, to embed the desire for children to exercise in a fun way;
- Subscribe to ‘Mid Sussex Active’ to provide competitive sporting competitions and support to the school’s leadership to develop and enhance PE and sport within the school and the Burgess Hill locality.
