Dear Parents and Carers,

Spring term has been very busy and productive and I would like to share a few of the headline moments with you.

West Sussex Local Authority Visit

As part of the local authorities annual evaluation of all schools we received a visit from two experienced senior advisers in February. The report we received was glowing and included quotes such as...'Many aspects of leadership are at least good with outstanding features. Inexperienced teachers show a remarkable ability to speak with clarity, confidence and pedagogical awareness beyond their career stage.

All school leaders and class teachers have shared, strong, high realistic expectations for all pupils including those with SEND and other vulnerable groups. These expectations are based on rigorous baseline assessment, monitoring and tracking of pupil progress at all leadership levels. Evidence of this can be seen in the classroom, books and monitoring and tracking of steps of progress towards targets made by all pupils. Foundation subjects are given equally high weighting e.g. art sketch books. The learning walks identified outstanding teaching of foundation subjects including opportunities for food technology' We are very proud of the local authorities views and continue to work hard on improving all aspects of school life.

Science Week at Southway

In March we spent a week immersing the children in all things scientific and the school was full of experiments, tests and research. Hopefully we have inspired the next crop of Einstein's!

Visits from West Sussex schools

Over the course of the term we hosted the staff from schools such as Warninglid Primary, Turners Hill Primary and Birchwood Grove Primary to come and see our excellent teaching practice as part of their own school development. Next term we have further requests from schools which we will be arranging in due course.

School visits and trips

I have lost count of the number of school trips and visits our children have taken part in but they include numerous Rainbow Theatre appearances, trips to the British Museum, a Hindu Temple and the Seven Sisters.

To represent the County at a national tournament was an honour and we did Sussex proud losing just one game. We hope to continue to build on our successes in the future.
